Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Social Security number and credit history - overdraft history and payment history - transaction history and transaction or loss history <p>When you are <i>no longer</i> our member, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>

How?	All financial companies need to share members' personal information to run their everyday business. What we do

<p>How does Tri Boro Federal Credit Union protect my personal information?</p>	<p>To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings. We have multifactor authentication via Homebanking; extra layer customer identification programs with all transactions are enforced.</p>
<p>How does Tri Boro Federal Credit Union collect my personal information?</p>	<p>We collect your personal information, for example, when you</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - open an account or deposit money - pay your bills or apply for a loan - apply for financing <p>We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.</p>
<p>Why can't I limit all sharing?</p>	<p>Federal law gives you the right to limit only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes – information about your creditworthiness - affiliates from using your information to market to you - sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you <p>State law and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.</p>

Definitions

<p>Affiliates</p>	<p>Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>Tri Boro Federal Credit Union has no affiliates</i>
<p>Nonaffiliates</p>	<p>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>Nonaffiliates we share with can include insurance companies, government agencies, plastic card processors (credit/debit/ATM), financial statement publishers or printers, mail house, consumer reporting agencies, data processors, and check/share draft printers</i>
<p>Joint Marketing</p>	<p>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>Our joint marketing partners include CUNA Mutual Group's MEMBERCONNECT</i>
